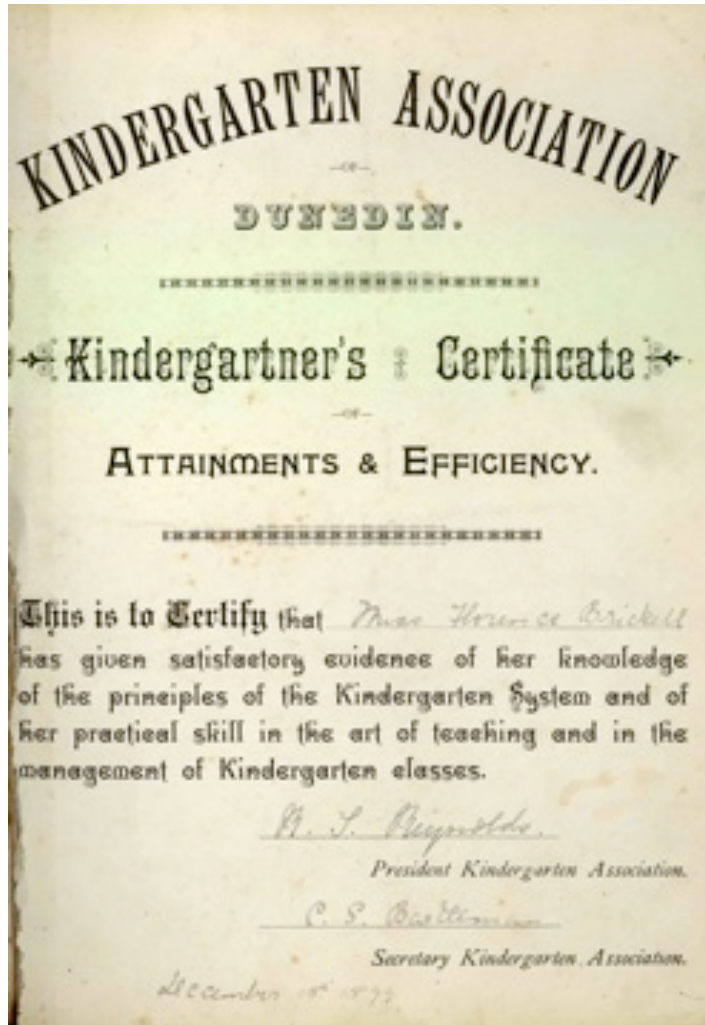


Miss Florence Brickell's Workbook of Froebel Occupations, 1889 Dunedin

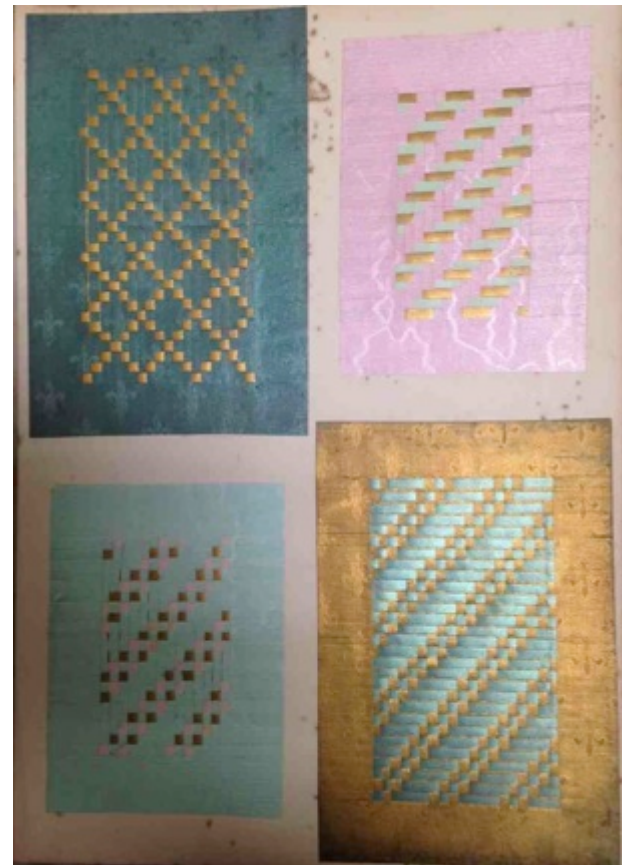
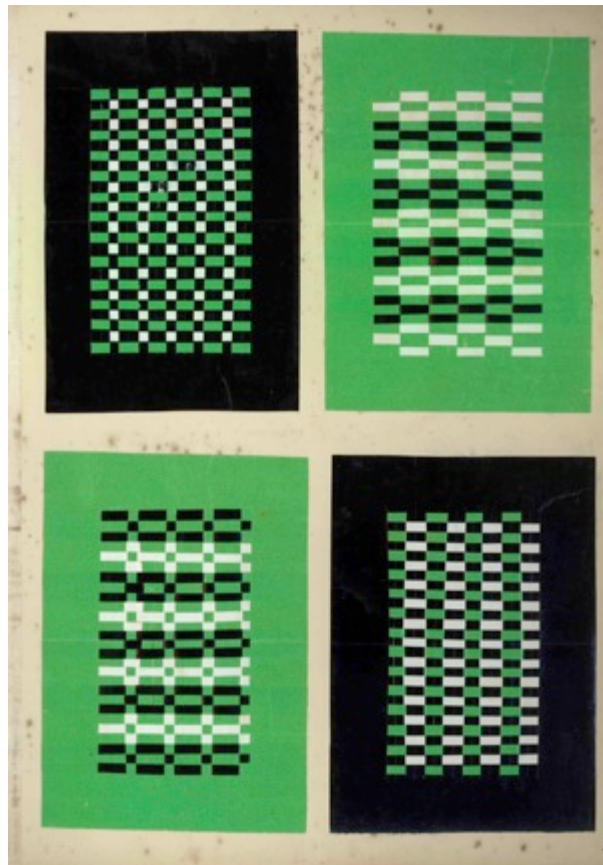


A standard requirement for kindergarten trainees throughout the 19th century was the production of a workbook demonstrating the trainee's abilities in the arts and crafts of the Froebelian occupations. These workbooks are found in museum collections of kindergarten materials world-wide. There is one other known occupation workbook in New Zealand belonging to Mary Hitchcock at the Alexander Turnbull Library, Ref: MSX-8895.

The Froebel Occupations provide materials for practices in skills relating to: solids, surfaces, lines, points and reconstruction. The number of Occupations varies and in some records the occupations are listed under Gifts, being the Froebel blocks.
