

ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS RAISED AT SYMPOSIUM.

1. FUND-RAISING: For many years, the FWER KINDERGARTEN ASSOCIATION COUNCIL MEMBERS RAISED THE MONEY TO BUILD & MAINTAIN KINDIES IN THE WGTN AREA, CALLING FOR & GETTING FULL SUPPORT, HELP & EFFORT FROM PARENTS IN THE AREAS.

DURING MY TIME AT BERHAMPTON & NGAIO AS DIRECTOR IN THE 40S, A SMALL FEE WAS ASKED FOR PER WEEK, BUT NOT ENFORCED FOR CLEARLY HARD-UP PARENTS, OR THE CHR. AT THE B'PORE ORPHANAGE.

Fund-raising took the form of an Annual Stall each year, for which the mothers knitted, sewed and gathered material for months ahead, & then provided copious baking on the day.

TWO COUNCIL MEMBERS WERE ASSIGNED TO EACH KINDE, & PAID ANNUAL FORMAL VISITS, & CAME TO OPEN (& FINANCIALLY SUPPORT) THE ANNUAL STALL.

The Mothers' Clubs were the hub of many of these activities, and always supported staff with mending, taking part in activities when asked (as supervisor helpers on outings e.g.), repainting or curtaining etc. They had a monthly stall too, at their meetings.

When the Talents' Evenings began, Berhampton had already established these Evening Concert Fund-raising occasions, and then combined with other clubs, hosted these at B'pore until they got too big.

Fathers were always ready to a) mend equipment, support Saturday Fathers' mornings; set up stalls, & run games for the chn. on Annual Stall day.

My previous Director at B'pore, JUNE MC BRIDE (MORRIS) began the first Fathers' Club held monthly at B'pore with some real success - not in numbers, but in quality of the speakers we invited, & the continued support of the 20 odd who came.

The Property was owned by the Assoc., but maintained mainly by parents - lawn-cutting, gardening, painting etc, assisted by staff when possible.

EQUIPMENT Each Kindy had; a sand-pit, (late with cover) trucks to push around,

A few 3-wheeler-tricycles, a swing, small wheel-barrows, a Water-container for water-play at chn's height; a climbing frame with steps & Safety bars; skipping ropes, balls of diff.sizes, & big pipes to crawl through, plus sand-pit buckets, spades etc.

Males formed an annual roster to provide & serve morning tea to staff, & apples & water/milk to chn.

They then cleaned up & took towels to wash. Ray often joined in activities afterwards.

The parent Committees met regularly - mainly fares in my day, & kept a sharp eye out on Staff, building maintenance & cleanliness - kept the books & accounted at Annual Meetings each year.

Programmes

As a student, after the first weeks of initial Theory; we spent the mornings observing in various Kinderg., returning to the Kind. Training College in Tavasaki in the afternoons for lectures. As the year progressed, we took an active part in activities, & were encouraged to initiate new ones & supervise them.

The Training College proceeded upstairs, above the Nursery School below. This was open from 8 - 4 for parents to carry out enforced work in factories during the war.

The chn. were given morning & aftn. snacks, & a hot nutritious meal mid-day, followed by a compulsory hour's sleep on stretchers, in curtain-drawn rooms.

In those early days, the chn. were divided into groups named TINES (3-3½ M.D.) LES 3½ to 4½ & TOPS (4+5)

The Tines met for half the morning in the smaller room on left of front of Kindy; the Tops in the main Hall, & the Middles in the Sun-Room at back, for Stories, Singing, news talks & some group play or outings; then joined the others for free play out & indoors.

PLAY Blockplay (large sanded-off solid blocks of all lengths - some bridge - 1, 2, 3, 4)
