Lynnette Harris (later Barlow) kindergarten teacher trainee1972-1973

Lynnette Harris entered kindergarten teacher training in 1972, at the Christchurch Kindergarten Association's Hatfield House, one of around 80 girls enrolled across the two year groups. Lynnette's carefully archived collection of documents provide valuable insights into the changing nature of kindergarten teacher training in the early 1970s. A time when trainees purchased smocks along with their textbooks for the sum of \$40.00 and when course fees were a mere \$10.00. Married women had been accepted into training since 1962 and men were soon to be. Pregnancy ended some studentships. Women were expected to resign before they were visibly pregnant. A time when students were becoming more vocal winning an early dispute over the right to wear dress pants. Their voice was to grew stronger with the decade. This intake was second to last before control of kindergarten teacher training was transferred from the Kindergarten Associations to the Teachers' College Councils. A time that saw the start of the end of an era for kindergarten.

> For all Kindergarten visits - professional attire is the rule, i.e. very short, very long or extreme fashions are not professional.

> Low heeled shoes are worn in College and kindergartens - not jandals. Sandals should have some support for the heel, e.g.sling straps.

As Christchurch winters (and summers) are sometimes very cold, we advise students to bring some warm clothing and underwear.

Students must come to College prepared for physical education with gym shoes and appropriate rompers. (Secondary College games rompers are quite suitable.)
