We are now in a position to be able to calculate a financial budget. Our expenses for Caretaking and Cleaning, Electricity, Phones, Materials, Equipment repairs, Council levies and Insurances and petty cash and sundries amount to \$130 a month. Our present income from parent donations amounts to \$91.00. This leaves a balance of \$39.00 a month which the Committee needs to find from fundraising while at the same time needing to build up the level of equipment which is urgently required.

At this time in the life of the Kindergarten the Committee needs all the financial support possible to ensure the Kindy's success.
